## FUN FACTS

---

Recycled aluminum saves 95% energy vs. virgin aluminum; recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to run a TV for 3 hours or keep a 100-watt bulb burning for almost four hours (Reynolds Metal Company).

Enough aluminum is thrown away to rebuild our commercial air fleet 4 times every year.

Tossing away an aluminum can wastes as much energy as pouring out half of that can's volume in gasoline.

Recycled glass saves 50% energy vs. virgin glass (Center for Ecological Technology); recycling one glass container saves enough energy to light a 100-watt bulb for 4 hours (EPA).

If we recycled every plastic bottle we used, we would keep 2 billion tons of plastic out of the landfills (Penn State).

We use enough plastic wrap to wrap all of Texas every year (EPA).

Each ton of paper recycled saves 17 trees and 7,000 gallons of water (EPA).

Every year, enough paper is thrown away to make a 12' wall from New York to California.

## CANS AND CONTAINERS

Aluminum -Cans  
-Trays  
-Foil

Steel Cans and Tins

Aseptic Packaging & Gable Top Containers  
(milk & juice cartons)



Soda & Water Bottles  
(#1 clear and green plastic resin)



Milk, Juice, or Detergent Jugs  
(#2 clear or colored plastic resin)



PVC Narrow Neck Containers ONLY  
(#3 plastic resin)



LDPE Grocery Containers &  
the rings from 6 or 12 packs  
(#4 plastic resin)



PP Grocery Containers  
(#5 plastic resin)



Narrow Neck ONLY  
(#7 plastic resin)

NO Plastic Film (NO sheets, tarps, or wrap)

**ALL RECYCLABLES MUST BE  
RINSED AND SCRAPED CLEAN**

## PLASTIC BUCKETS

-Are accepted if under 5 Gallon size  
-The metal handle must be removed and  
thrown away.

## GLASS

Glass Bottles and Jars that are:

-Green  
-Clear  
-Brown

**NO Windows, Dinnerware, or Ceramics**

## PAPER AND CARDBOARD

Newspaper and Inserts—Remove plastic  
sleeves

Cardboard—No waxed cardboard

Kraft Bags—Brown paper bags

Magazines, Catalogs and Telephone Books

Office & Computer Notebooks

Gift Wrap Paper

Chipboard—Cereal, food mix boxes, gift  
boxes, shoe boxes, etc.

Carrier Stock—Soda & beer can carrying  
cases

Junk Mail & Envelopes

Paper Back Books—No hard cover books

**NO metal clips, spirals, binders, plastic  
cards or stick on labels**

**All Recycling materials can now be put  
into one container. No sorting necessary.**
