ORDINANCE NO. O2020-26

**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DISPOSITION OF PERSONAL PROPERTY
OWNED BY THE CITY OF WARRENVILLE**

WHEREAS, the City of Warrenville (the “City”) is a municipal corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the City of Warrenville is the owner of certain personal property, as more particularly set forth on a schedule listing that property and attached as **Exhibit A**; and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council believe, find and hereby declare that the personal property identified on the attached schedule is no longer necessary or useful to the City in that because of its age and condition, said property cannot be utilized by any of the City’s current needs or operations and is therefore considered as surplus personal property and it is in the best interests of the City to dispose of same;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR/COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WARRENVILLE, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE: The foregoing recitals shall be, and they are hereby, incorporated within this Section One as findings of fact as if said recitals were fully set forth herein.

SECTION TWO: Pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, and the findings of the corporate authorities as set forth hereinabove, the City is hereby authorized, by and through its Police Chief, to sell the property set forth on Exhibit A at online auction, through Obenauf Auction Service, Inc., with or without advertising, at the best price possible. Said sales may include such terms and conditions as the Police Chief and City Administrator, upon approval of the City Attorney, shall determine to be appropriate.

SECTION THREE: The City Administrator and the Police Chief, acting jointly, may add additional items of personal property to the schedule of items that is Exhibit A, provided that such items are either of no apparent value to the City or such item is of less than \$25.00 each in value. The sale of such additional items will be presented to the City Council for final approval no later than the second regular meeting of the City Council, occurring after the items on Exhibit A are offered for sale. In the event that any items on Exhibit A are not sold after reasonable effort has been made to sell same, such items are hereby deemed to be of no value and may be disposed of by the Police Chief and City Administrator in the most cost effective manner possible.

SECTION FOUR: Any policy, resolution or ordinance of the City which conflicts with this ordinance shall be and is hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION FIVE: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the majority of the corporate authorities then holding office and publication in the manner provided by law.

At the November 26, 2018, Public Safety & Finance Committee of the Whole (PSFC) meeting, authorization to dispose of two police vehicles, an Emergency Management Agency vehicle, and two Article 36 seized vehicles was brought before the Committee, and was subsequently approved (O2018-58, dated December 3, 2018). A third surplus police vehicle was inadvertently excluded from the meeting's exhibit list (*Exhibit 1 - Vehicles to be auctioned by Obenauf Auctions*). This third vehicle was addressed in the May 29, 2018, PSFC meeting agenda backup material seeking approval for the purchase of its replacement, and has since been sold at auction (\$5,900) on June 30, 2020. I am seeking approval from the City Council to authorize disposal of this surplus property, which has already been sold.
