### **BPAC City Council Liaison Designation and Commissioner Appointments**

On Monday August 2<sup>nd</sup>, Alderman Clare Barry was designated to serve as the City Council Liaison to the Bicyclist and Pedestrian Advisory Commission (BPAC). Further, Commissioner Harlan Davis was appointed as Chairman of BPAC, and Mark Kasprzyk was appointed as a BPAC Commissioner.

### **Request from DuPage County for BPAC Commissioner to Sit on Trails Users Committee**

The Senior Transportation Planner with the DuPage County Department of Transportation, Sidney Kenyon, is seeking a representative from BPAC to sit on a Trail Users Committee. The committee will work to put together a DuPage Trails Plan. The purpose of this project is to form a plan on how to enhance and maintain the County's regional trails network, with a focus on the IPP, GWT, and Southern DuPage Regional Trail. This is effectively replacing and updating DuPage County DOT's Trails Maintenance Policy.

The county has had an engagement plan within the Trails Maintenance Policy to guide work and coordination with local stakeholders. The County views municipalities and trail users as stakeholders, and as such wants to involve bike and pedestrian commissions to represent that trail user perspective. They would like a member from BPAC commission to be a representative.

The plan will take approximately 18 months to complete. The county will schedule no more than two to three meetings throughout the project. One to two of those meetings will be focused on feedback and dialogue with the commission representatives, and the final meeting will be to present the draft final plan. Until further notice, the meetings would be held virtually and would likely be held during the day between 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM.
