### **DuPage County Environmental Committee**

The following things were discussed at the February 1st meeting of the DuPage County Environmental Committee. Attached are the summary of minutes.

- The Committee recommended participation in a pilot program with the Forest Preserve District for recycling of one pound propane cylinders. The County will pay the cost for collection of the cylinders at Blackwell Forest Preserve from May to September.
- An update was provided on the 2022 Document Shredding Program. Twelve events have been approved for funding to date.
- A pilot program for campaign sign recycling will occur after the primary and general elections.

### **DuPage County Stormwater Management Committee**

The following things were discussed at the January 4th meeting of the DuPage County Stormwater Management Committee. Attached are the summary of minutes.

- The Committee recommended approval of an intergovernmental agreement with the Medinah Park District for the Sycamore Avenue Drainage Improvement Project. This small project will utilize inhouse County staff, cost approximately \$3,500, and alleviate nuisance flooding.
- The Committee recommended approval of an intergovernmental agreement with the Elmhurst Park District and Village of Villa Park for the Sugar Creek Restoration Project. The project is funded through a Water Quality Improvement Grant not to exceed \$60,000.

### **B20 Club Member (Public Works)**

#### *Strategic Plan Goal #3: Open Space and Environment*

On January 20, th City became a member of the B20 Club, a nonprofit partnership between the Illinois Soybean Association checkoff program and the American Lung Association. The B20 Club recognizes a select group of Illinois-based organizations (municipal, public, and private) with strong commitments to run fleets on 20% or greater biodiesel blends, which are fuels that offer a cleaner, healthier alternative to standard diesel. Along with the recognition, the B20 Club helps connect members to free training related to biodiesel and fleet procurement, as well as education on the benefits of biodiesel. The B20 club may be able to offer support at various City events. In a few weeks, the American Lung Association will provide the City more detailed information that highlights how the fleet's use of biodiesel fuel has benefited the community. 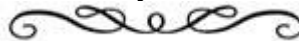

**7. LEGISLATIVE**

- A. House/Senate Bill -- HB4356 & SB3040 Carpet Stewardship Act

Ms. Joy Hinz informed the committee these bills are geared toward the manufacturers to be responsible for the collection, transportation and recycling of carpet.

The committee approved this unanimously.



- B. House/Senate Bill -- HB1780 Drug Take-Back Act

Ms. Joy Hinz explained this bill is for the pharmaceutical companies to provide for the collection of unused or expired medications with a minimum of 1 per 50,000 people. DuPage County currently exceeds this minimum.

Member Chavez inquired about where to find this information regarding locations. Ms. Hinz will send information and noted all of this is located on the DuPage County website. There are currently about 22-25 locations available.

The committee approved this unanimously.

## A. Discussion -- FY2021 Strategic Initiative Implementation Summary Updates

Ms. Hinz went over the main strategic initiatives summary. The first is the Cool DuPage program showing the goal set for 2030 is a 20% reduction of greenhouse gases since 2007 and currently it is at a 22% reduction. She is hopeful ComEd will be able to provide data showing how much energy is generated from solar energy. Next, the development of disposal options for the hard to manage items. The Household Hazardous Waste facility is now accepting e-cigarettes, which contribute significantly as litter as well as a threat to human health and the environment. Recycling programs with electronics, books and textiles are ongoing throughout the County.

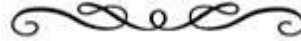

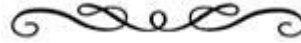
